Someone who lives in the same area as you.	<p>Many faiths have a description of how the Earth, the universe and everything in it, were created. Christians, Muslims, and Jews share the creation story, told at the very beginning of their holy texts in a book called Genesis, which means 'origin' or 'source' – where things first began.</p> <p>Not everyone has a faith, and we will explore how people of many walks of life show care to others and to the natural world.</p> 	<p>Sikhism: Langar is the kitchen in a Gurdwara – the Sikh place of worship. After the weekly act of worship, Sikh communities serve a free, shared meal. This is provided to all, regardless of race, faith, or economic status, and does not require attendance at the act of worship. It is simply an act of kindness.</p>  <p>One of the 5 pillars of Islam is Zakah – an obligation to give money to the poor. It is generally voluntary and a set percentage of someone's wealth.</p>
Waiter	Someone who serves another. Someone trained and skilled in looking out for what another person needs.
