| Humanism   | Is a belief system which looks into science rather than religion to understand the world.         |  |
| Humanist   | A follower of humanism  |  |
| Atheist  | Someone who does not believe in a God or gods.  |  |
| Theist   | Someone who believes that there is a god or gods.   |  |
| Agnostic   | Someone who believes you can never know for sure whether God exists or not.                       |  |
| Evidence   | Available body of facts which indicate whether a belief is true or valid.                         |  |

| Values   | The beliefs that help you to decide what is right and wrong and how to act in various situations. |  |

Humanist Symbol

The humanist symbol is called the Happy Human. It was designed by Dennis Barrington who won a competition organized by the British Humanist Association in 1965. The symbol was chosen for its simplicity, for its happy appearance, happiness and humanity being central concepts to humanists, and for its H-shape, standing for Humanism.



Non-Religious World View

Humanists seek to live good lives without following a religion. Their moral values are based on human nature and life experiences.

Golden Rule

Humanists believe. in a ‘Golden Rule’, which is ‘Treat other people as you would like them to treat you.’ They believe you should always consider how your actions will affect other people and you should think about how you would feel in someone else’s situation.
